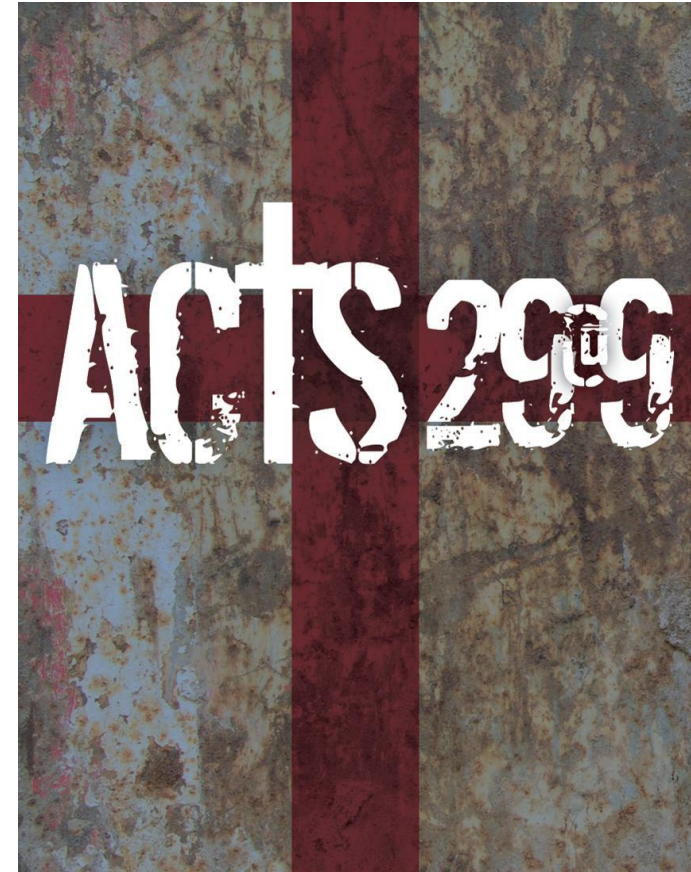

## WHAT WOULD JESUS DO?

As we journey through this season of Lent, we are focusing on the Lord's Prayer (which is really Jesus' Disciples' Prayer) and Praying the Psalms. Jesus spent much time in prayer. The gospels tell us frequently Jesus went by himself to a lonely place to pray. Before Jesus began his public ministry, before he called his first disciples, before he met crowds who wanted to hear from him, before he faced the cross...Jesus prayed. When the disciples who followed Jesus wanted to know about his prayer life, Jesus gave a model prayer. We pray the Lord's prayer during worship, but it is also a model for our own prayers. As you hear the messages on this prayer, ask yourself...what would Jesus do? How would Jesus pray? What is Jesus calling me to do?



Jesus also was steeped in the Psalms, the book of hymns, songs, laments and praise. He was less concerned about the historical context of these Psalms and more concerned with how the Psalms can draw us closer to God. Take up praying the Psalms in your devotional life. Pray: "Lord, open my mind and heart to hear what you want me to hear today." Read a Psalm or portion of a Psalm aloud and listen for what God wants you to hear. Do this 2-3 times. What in your life do you need to eradicate in order to be more like Jesus? What does this Psalm call you to do today?

Jesus is calling us to look, talk and be more like him!

Pray: "Lord, open my mind and heart to hear what you want me to hear today." Read a Psalm or portion of a Psalm aloud and listen for what God wants you to hear. Do this 2-3 times. What in your life do you need to eradicate in order to be more like Jesus? What does this Psalm call you to do today?

Jesus is calling us to look, talk and be more like him!
