THE JARRETT AUSTIN & CHILDREN'S FUND ANNUAL GOLF TOURNAMENT

This golf tournament is sponsored by Mt. Pleasant United Methodist Church to raise funds for those in the community who have extraordinary medical needs and expenses. It was started to raise money to provide a wheelchair for a young man in their congregation named Jared Austin who was diagnosed with Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy. Jared passed away in December of 2004.

To date, this fund has provided medication for a liver transplant recipient, cancer treatment, a medically necessary air conditioner for a shut-in, insulin pumps, prosthetic limbs, and has helped several families with out-of-pocket medical expenses. Benefits have totaled more than \$257,000 since the inception of this fund.

This event will take place on Saturday, April 20, 2024 at Brookwood Golf Course. Registration is at 8AM and it begins at 8:30AM. Entry fee is \$300 per team . A breakfast and picnic lunch will be served.

Let everything that breathes
praise the Lord! (Psalm 150:6)

As the women head to the tomb after the Sabbath to anoint and prepare Jesus' body as was the custom for burial, they rise early and go with heavy hearts. Jesus was crucified so close to the Sabbath, there was barely time to place him in the tomb. As disappointing as the death of Jesus is, they are determined to honor him according to their customs. On days when it is hard to rise at all, it is especially hard to prepare for all the obstacles that lie ahead. Mark's gospel tells us that on the way they asked each other, "Who will roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb?" (16:3). We all come up against stones we are powerless to move that get in the way of the work God has for us. Faith is rising and setting out anyway. Mark 16:4 tells us "But when they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had been rolled away."

Recently, I got to visit with some of our older members. For them the stones may be the hands they long to hold but are out of reach, not being able to live independently in the places they once called home, or the arthritis or back pain that makes once simple tasks like coming to church or making a meal more complicated than the young can imagine. Death is often not feared by these saints. They have witnessed it coming for many they love, and they know it will come for them. They do not resist death like the young whose stones may come from lack of sleep tending their young, financial burdens that seem insurmountable or kidney stones from too much caffeine trying to stay awake for it all. Our elders have known these stones too, but they were long ago overcome. We rise anyway, some of us longing for quiet and others visited by the memories of the noise of companionship that has given way to silence.

We rise holding on to some measure of hope, however small. Jan Richardson's writes in her poem *The Magdelene's Blessing* about Mary encountering Jesus and him calling her by name:

You hardly imagined standing here, everything you ever loved suddenly returned to you, looking you in the eye, and calling your name.

And now you do not know how to abide this hole in the center of your chest, where a door slams shut and swings open at the same time, turning on the hinge of your aching and hopeful heart.

This is an invitation, a choice, a threshold, a gate.

This is your life calling to you from a place you could never have dreamed, but now that you have glimpsed it's edge, you cannot imagine choosing another way.

So let the tears come as anointing, as consecration, and then let them go.

Let this blessing gather itself around you.

Let it give you what you will need for this journey.

You will not remember the words-they do not matter.

All you need to remember is how it sounded when you stood in the place of death and heard the living call your name.

Jesus calls us each by name. Perhaps we hear him best in the thin places. Jesus speaks the hope of resurrection and promise of eternal life. Praise God for the blessings of Easter!
